The good news is that with the influx of summer visitors comes lots of places to stay, many of which are adult-only and afford romancing couples plenty of privacy.

Santorini knows how to host a good [honeymoon](#), and it starts with the idyllic location; nothing beats Greek island downtime with your loved one as you soak in the orange and pink sunset hues that float across the sky, turning the dramatic caldera rockface a shade of red, and reflecting in the spectacular sea below. Many of Santorini's best honeymoon hotels offer front-row, view-for-two seats of the coveted caldera from their rooms, [villas](#) and suites. Lots come with a private hot tub or plunge pool to soak in, too. Others make the most of the island in a different way; choosing spaces away from the most popular spots to offer peace, serenity and indulgence in lesser-explored towns and [villages](#).

There's no denying that Santorini draws the crowds – often far too many of them – but here, at some of the [best hotels in Greece](#), let alone on the island, you'll likely forget that anyone else even exists, instead slipping into a romantic escape for two. Andronis Concept Wellness Hotel

There are four Andronis hotels in Santorini and, honestly, you can't go far wrong at any of them – honeymoon or not. But if your idea of a romantic getaway includes nourishing your bodies, as well as your souls and minds, then Andronis Concept is the name you need to know. In a strikingly unique setting – there's no whitewashed walls here, instead replaced by ochre-toned buildings and black floors – this hotel focuses on all things wellness (and what better place to do it; Santorini's land and sea are both said to have healing powers). Mornings might start with a sunrise sun-salutation overlooking the caldera, and be followed by a hike along the Fira to Oia path or a saunter around the hotel's herb garden, which grows fragrant thyme, lavender and oregano – all of which end up in dishes served at the on-site restaurant, Throubi. Or, you might want to do nothing more than soak in the spa together, which is a perfectly acceptable way to spend a day (or more). Treatments include massages, facials, and full-body rituals designed to empower, harmonise, and promote better sleep.
